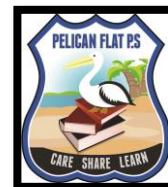

Wow! What another busy week. We have been looking at speech or quotation marks in class. Students should understand the grammar associated with them, but could do with some reinforcement. So give them a quiz. They will love it!! The grammar should look like this:
